Nature comes first, human beings are only visitors. Out of respect for the environment, please stay on the signposted cycle paths, do not leave litter behind and avoid doing cycle tours at dusk. The numerous and often rare animal and plant species in the *Allgäu* will thank you. Please also take to heart the advice of the *#NatürlichSommer* campaign run by the German Alpine Association on behaviour in natural settings. In addition to treating the animal and plant world with care, relaxing tours also depend upon interacting in a friendly way with all other sports enthusiasts.

Protected areas

In the *Füssen* area there are a number of protected areas that call for particularly considerate behaviour and where special regulations usually apply. Lake *Hopfensee*, lake *Weißensee*, lake *Forggensee*, lake *Schwansee*, lake *Alpsee* and *Faulenbach* valley, for example, are located in a landscape conservation area. Some areas are also designated as FFH areas (fauna flora habitat areas) and there is a bird sanctuary that stretches from lake *Alatsee* to Garmisch-Partenkirchen. Lake *Bannwaldsee* and large parts of the *Ammergebirge* mountains are designated as nature reserves. In all protected areas, please read the relevant information sign carefully and comply with the regulations. Nature will thank you.

Please select tours according to your ability. It is especially important to realistically assess your fitness level and/or the battery capacity of your E-bike. Allow for breaks. Please note that E-bikes have an enormous dead weight due to their motors and batteries: this means a significantly increased braking distance and it makes pushing much more difficult, too. Please be considerate of walkers, hikers and other road users. And be sure to observe route closures and traffic regulations, too.

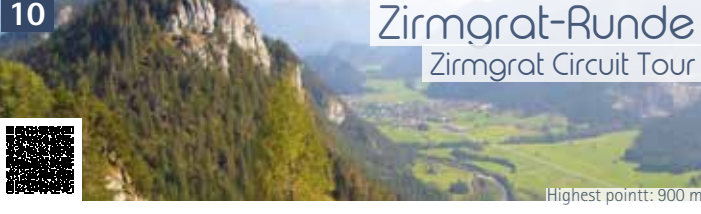

Cycle around Bavaria's fifth largest lake, which only reaches its full water level in summer. This is the main reservoir for the downstream power plants and also for flood control. You can shorten the tour by taking a boat trip (Forggensee boat cruise from June 1st – October 15th).

Forggensee, *Illasbergsee* and *Hegratsriedsee*, *Forggensee* boat cruise, *Festspielhaus Neuschwanstein*

This cross-border tour takes you once around the *Zirmgrat* ridge south-west of *Füssen*. Here you will see the *Falkenstein* castle ruin at the far west of the elongated mountain range. It is Germany's highest-altitude castle ruin (1268 m).

lake *Alatsee*, lake *Weißensee*, *Waldlerlebniszentrum* (Forest Experience Centre), *Lechfall* (waterfall)

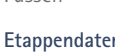

Two stages of the *Allgäu* Circuit Tour are combined here to form a moderately undulating loop through the *Allgäu Schlosspark*. This tour takes you to the most beautiful spots in the *Allgäu*. Sometimes flat, sometimes hilly and often set against a magnificent mountain panorama.

Forggensee boat cruise, *Maria Hilf* pilgrimage church, the lakes *Hopfensee* & *Forggensee*

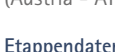

Go with the flow and explore the "last wild river" in the Alps by bike – the river *Lech*. Over a lengthy stretch, this cross-border stage follows the lake *Forggensee* – which the *Lech* flows through almost unnoticed – and leads upstream to villages *Lechaschau* and *Weißenbach* in the Tyrolean *Lech* valley.

There's something for everyone – from gently sloping and sometimes almost flat routes to mountain bike tours with elevation gain. All the tours feature captivating scenic attractions, with some also offering wonderful views of the royal castles of *Neuschwanstein* and *Hohenschwangau* set against a majestic mountain backdrop. Most of the tours go past the various lakes, providing a perfect opportunity to swim or relax. There are also several traditional stop-off points such as alpine dairies where you can get a drink and a bite to eat.

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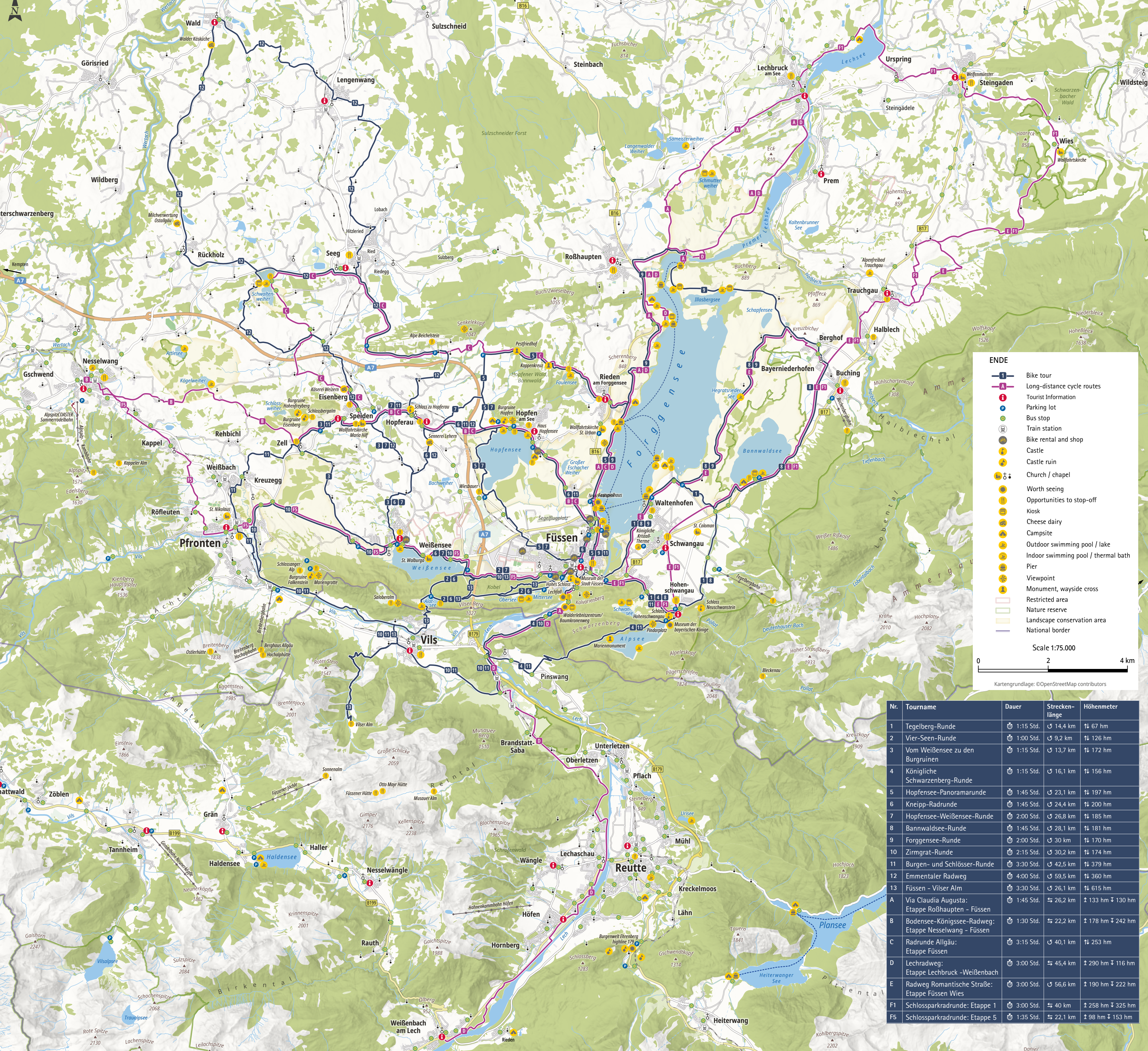

Taking bicycles with you on local public passenger transport

As a guest in Füssen, the Füssen Card (the guest card of Füssen) allows you to travel on numerous local public transport lines at no extra cost. In addition, bicycles can be taken along free of charge on all buses. Please note that bicycles can only be transported if capacity is available, however. On busy routes, such as those to the royal castles, there may be no more room for bicycles on the buses at peak times. There is no legal entitlement to taking a bicycle on a bus. The offer of free bicycle transport does not apply on trains.



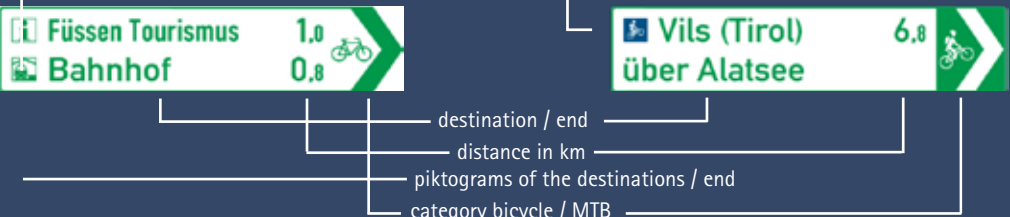
Signposting of cycle paths

Small intermediate signposts are provided for better guidance. Explicitly signposted tours are identified directly on the signposts by the logos that appear by the descriptions.

The cycling and MTB signage used by our Austrian neighbours in Tyrol differs from that in Germany, but the marking for MTB difficulty levels is the same.
